October is National Disability Employment Awareness Month

Every October, National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM) is a time to celebrate the many and varied contributions of America's workers with disabilities.

Across our nation workers with disabilities are making a serious contribution to businesses. Locally we have approximately 80 individuals served by the Erie County Board of DD employed in the community. This is a great start but we still have a ways to go. Nearly 90 individuals have expressed a desire to

work in the community and are currently seeking full or part time employment.

It is easy to focus on what someone cannot do especially when talking about finding work outside of a sheltered setting. NDEAM is about focusing on what someone can do.

We are trying hard in Erie County to share these "can do" stories with employers and the community. We recently captured personal stories in a short film called "Our

Employment Stories". This video premiered on September 19, 2015 at the Sandusky Artisans Center as a part of the Sandusky Film Festival.

It was a powerful experience hearing young adults confidently give their "I can" statements:

"I can write computer code", "I can work at the YMCA", "I can volunteer and give back", "I can go to college", "I can be a writer", "I can do and be anything".

This October, think about all the things you can do. Think about how you can raise awareness for workers with disabilities. Lets celebrate NDEAM!

is a tool. No "spot" or definition is ever going to be able to fully reflect someone's goals, ambitions, work history or experience, or what they will achieve. It is almost silly to think the 800 people served by the ECBDD will fall neatly into 4 spots.

Families and individuals should take the path for what it is - a tool, a way to start the conversation about employment.

Ohio Employment First - Career Discovery


[Employment First was signed into rule in 2012](#) by Governor Kasich. A part of the rule includes defining different words or phrases.

Knowing the language and words of the Employment First rule may help you to feel more empowered when it comes to making employment decisions.

This month's definition is Career Discovery. "Career Discovery is a person-centered assessment and planning process that determines a job seekers preferences, interests, support needs/accommodations and skills resulting in a Career Discovery Profile". The end

profile can be used in various plans or to help determine where someone falls on the Path to Employment.

Career Discovery uses a team approach to get to know the person in depth. The information gathering process includes a home visit, interviews, social and vocational observations and a benefits analysis. The finished profile will guide the team in finding the best possible community employment option for the person. Read more [here](#)


Join experts as they talk about the difference between high school and college for students with disabilities. Interactive hands on session for parents and students. This is an EHOVE "Hot Topic" event.

Benefits Analysis Now Available

"I want to work but what will happen to my benefits?" This is a common and very reasonable concern, which is why benefits analysis is an important service. The Clearwater COG (Council of Government) has hired Benefits Expert Dawn McDuffit to provide

benefits counseling to Erie and other Clearwater COG counties. Benefits Counseling is a great place to start if you are looking to start a new job in the community or hoping to work more hours. This service is free and open to those who receive board services.

Individuals and families looking to learn more about benefits analysis should talk with their Service and Support Administrator (SSA). Next issue we will talk about the new [benefits calculator](#) being launched by DODD.



Coming soon! Special transition counselors from OOD

Through the Transition Services Partnership with the Ohio Department of Education (ODE), 26 dedicated Vocational Rehabilitation Counselors will be embedded in career technical planning districts and other local education agencies throughout the state. Opportunities for Ohioans with Disabilities (OOD) is in the process of hiring

new or assigning existing counselors to these positions. These counselors will collaborate with students with disabilities, their families, educators and
